Is there a limit to community generosity?

Following islanders' unprecedented response to the unprecedented challenges put before them by the pandemic in 2020, the Community Foundation entered 2021 uncertain about the year ahead. Would donors limit their giving after helping to meet so many pressing needs in 2020? If so, what would that mean for island nonprofits that rely on community support to sustain their programs?

We shouldn't have worried.

During the 2021 virtual fair, more than 500 people of all ages and means donated \$150,000 for local nonprofits in just four days. When the island's Head Start program needed to raise additional funds to complete construction of a newer, larger building, our donors stepped forward to close the gap. And instead of shying away from giving, more donors than ever proactively reached out to the Foundation to find out what community needs still existed and how they could help address those needs.

To everyone who contributed in 2021, we offer you our sincere thanks. Your sustained generosity remains central to our ability to help improve and enrich the quality of life here on San Juan Island.

APPROACHES TO GIVING

Whether it's supporting local nonprofits, helping island students achieve their educational or career training goals, or working with donors to maximize the impact of their gifts, the Community Foundation takes multiple approaches to philanthropic giving in order to best meet the broad range of needs within the San Juan Island community.



FOUNDATION-DIRECTED GRANTS

We award grants to nonprofits on San Juan Island multiple times each year through a grant-making process that carefully considers the impact of the funding requests we receive. In 2021 we provided \$206,000 in grants or fiscal sponsorship to 15 island nonprofits.



generosity of island donors, SJICF is able to provide substantial support to San Juan Island students pursuing higher education or career training. Four of our scholarship funds collectively distributed \$157,000 to 52 islanders with demonstrated financial need in 2021.



COUNTY FAIR GIVING Each year,

20 to 30 island nonprofits collaborate with SJICF to give San Juan County fair attendees the chance to come together and support a diverse mix of projects that benefit our community. During the 2021 virtual fair, fairgoers contributed \$150,000 to 23 island nonprofits.



ponor-advised giving SJICF gives islanders full control of their charitable giving, allowing them to make grants through Foundation-managed funds while receiving optimal tax advantages. In 2021, these donors combined to contribute \$344,000 to 44 organizations on San Juan Island and beyond.

FOUNDATION-DIRECTED GRANTS

The Community Foundation awards grants to nonprofit organizations on San Juan Island multiple times each year through our competitive grant-making process. In 2021, the Foundation provided \$206,000 in grants or fiscal sponsorship to 15 island organizations.



ENABLING EXPANSION OF THE HEAD START PROGRAM

Since 1968, the federally funded Head Start program A has helped promote the overall wellness of preschool-aged children from low-income families on San Juan Island by providing no-cost educational, nutritional, health, and social services. Managed by Skagit Valley College, Head Start currently offers in-person services to 16 children ages three to five for 3 ½ hours per day, four days per week. It also serves four children with disabilities who receive services through the San Juan Island School District. Since 2020 the program has operated from a temporary location — a single classroom at Friday Harbor Elementary — after leaving the small, aging, modular building it had called home for more than 30 years.

In 2021, SJICF and its generous donors ensured the continued success of Head Start by helping Skagit Valley College complete fundraising for a new three-classroom facility. Located adjacent to the elementary school, the larger building will allow for the creation of a new Early Head Start program, serving eight children ages two to three for 6 ½ hours per day, five days per week — increasing the total number of children served to 28. Existing preschool students will see their classroom time extended to 6 ½ hours per day, five days per week. The new building also includes additional space for program staff to connect participating children and their families to medical, dental, and mental health services.

Our emergency response fund grant to the Joyce L. Sobel Family Resource Center funded **481 hours of instruction for in-person learning pods** for children in grades two through seven who had struggled with remote education during the pandemic.



FUNDING POPULAR ISLAND PROGRAMS

Community Foundation grants funded projects at a dozen island organizations, including performances at the **San Juan Community Theatre**B, Family Art Days at the **San Juan Islands Museum of Art**, and community arts programming at **Alchemy Art Center**. They also provided education program tuition assistance for **Salish Sea Sciences**c and supported **The Whale Museum**'s scientific research, diving, and education program.

Foundation-directed grants helped the **Animal Protection Society of Friday Harbor** improve the safety of their exercise yard and continue their animal transport program. They allowed the San Juan Historical Society & Museum D to enhance their digital archiving capabilities, supported the 2021 grad night event organized by the Friday Harbor High School PTA, provided additional funding for **Kwiaht**'s Investigating Tick Ecology project, and contributed to the success of the San Juan County Economic **Development Council's** Youth Trades program. SJICF grants also provided operational support for the San Juan Islands Conservation District and Wolf Hollow Wildlife Rehabilitation Center.

The Community Foundation also acted as the fiscal sponsor for the 8.6 kW, 22-panel solar power system project at the **San Juan Island Grange**.

COUNTY FAIR GIVING

During the 2021 virtual San Juan County Fair, the Community Foundation gave fair attendees the chance to support specific projects organized by their favorite local nonprofits. The community responded by raising \$150,000 for 23 island organizations in just four days.




SUPPORTING CRITICAL ISLAND NEEDS

Islanders' donations during the virtual fair provided funding for mentorship, athletic, cultural, and social programming for the Young Adult Association of San Juan, a community service group for young adults ages 17-plus who are differently-abled. Those donations also supported the lower-income homebuying programs of the San Juan Community Home **Trust**, the four-year capital improvement project to create a healthier and more energyefficient facility at the Mullis Community Senior Center, and the outreach efforts of **Island Rides** , which provides door-to-door transportation services using emission-free vehicles to seniors, persons with disabilities, and people in need.

Community contributions funded key health and social programs, including the work of **SAFE San Juans**, who support survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault in San Juan County. Mt. Baker Planned Parenthood used their grant to provide reproductive health care services to islanders of all ages and incomes, while the grant for Soroptimist International of Friday Harbor went toward their cancer treatment transportation program, which provides ferry tickets to residents traveling to off-island appointments. Fair giving funds also supported design and planning work for the new San Juan Island Library building, which will help the library meet the needs of the community for decades to come.



The Animal Protection Society of Friday Harbor raised nearly \$15,000 during the 2021 fair to provide food, beds, treats, toys and enrichment items for **400 dogs and cats** spending time in the shelter prior to reaching their new homes.















EXPANDING THE IMPACT OF ISLAND NONPROFITS

Virtual fair donations supported the expansion of many unique island programs. They helped **Kwiáht** in their efforts to prepare and publish an illustrated guide to the native plants of San Juan Island. They provided operating expenses for **PADs for Parkinson's** , which trains bio-detection dogs located on San Juan Island to sniff out Parkinson's Disease. And they allowed the **San Juan Islands Agricultural Guild's** Farmers-to-Farmland program to help beginning farmers make informed land access decisions, learn how to finance land purchases, and receive on-site mentoring by experienced local farmers.

Funds raised during the fair giving campaign supported the Friends of Lime Kiln Society's education and stewardship programs, enabled the San Juan Island Sailing Foundation to purchase new boats and personal flotation devices, and allowed the San Juan Islands Museum of Art to upgrade their exhibition lighting. They helped Wolf Hollow Wildlife Rehabilitation Center care for injured and orphaned wildlife, such as baby harbor seals, swallow nestlings, ducklings, fox kits, and owlets. They even funded new exterior paint for the historic Nash House on the campus of Spring Street International School.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Each year, the Community Foundation accepts scholarship applications from San Juan Island students pursuing higher education or career training. Four of our scholarship funds collectively distributed \$157,000 to 52 islanders with demonstrated financial need in 2021.



INSKEEP LEGACY SCHOLARSHIP

Established through a gift from the estate of Jerry Inskeep, this program provides need-based funding for graduating high school seniors attending four-year colleges and universities full time. Scholarships can be renewed for each year of a student's undergraduate study.

JOHN VOLK MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The San Juan Pilots Association created this program to provide funding for students pursuing a career in an aviation-related field. It seeks to encourage and reward the sort of friendship, leadership, and service that typified John Volk's presence in our community.


The San Juan Island Community

program, or career training program.


MARCIA L. ZAKARISON SCHOLARSHIP

Established in memory of Dr. Marcia L. Zakarison, this program offers a one-time scholarship for graduating high school seniors pursuing a career in human medicine and the healing arts, either at technical or trade schools, or two- or four-year colleges or universities.

Since they were first awarded in 2008, Community Foundation scholarships have helped **158 San Juan Island high school graduates** achieve their higher education and career training goals by providing \$1.98 million in need-based financial aid.





FROM SAN JUAN ISLAND TO THE WORLD: SUPPORTING THE NEXT GENERATION OF SCHOLARS

The Community Foundation's 2021 scholarship recipients applied their knowledge, skills, and curiosity to a diverse array of studies, from business and finance to communications, journalism, digital technology and culture, elementary education, commercial aviation, interior design, illustration, architecture, and studio art. Many have chosen to focus their education on scientific pursuits, including kinesiology, biomedicine, health science, biochemistry, neuroscience, psychology, nursing, environmental science, mechanical engineering, and electrical engineering.

The 52 students who received scholarships in 2021 attended 25 institutions in 13 states and three countries: ATP Flight School, Anglo-American University (in the Czech Republic), Colorado School of Mines, Columbus College of Art & Design, Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, Gonzaga University, Green River Community College, Karolinska Institute (in Sweden), Pacific Lutheran University, Portland State University, Rhode Island School of Design, Santa Clara University, Savannah College of Art & Design, Seattle Pacific University, Stanford University, The Master's University, University of Arizona, University of Idaho, University of Montana, University of Oregon, University of Washington, Villanova University, Washington State University, Wellesley College, and Western Washington University.

DONOR-ADVISED GIVING

Many islanders choose to organize their giving through charitable funds managed by the Community Foundation. In 2021, these donors allocated \$344,000 to 44 organizations on San Juan Island, across the Pacific Northwest, and beyond.



ENHANCING THE SAN JUAN ISLAND COMMUNITY

Our donors directly supported more than 30 island nonprofits in 2021. Their generosity funded **critical community services** (Friday Harbor Food Bank, San Juan Island Library, Senior Services Council of San Juan County, United Way of San Juan County), local health and social programs (Compass Health, Hospice San Juan, Joyce L. Sobel Family Resource Center, Mt. Baker Planned Parenthood, SAFE San Juans), animal welfare initiatives (Animal Protection Society of Friday Harbor, Island Haven Animal Sanctuary, Wolf Hollow Wildlife Rehabilitation Center), and environmental advocacy efforts (Friends of the San Juans, San Juan Island Conservation District, San Juan Preservation Trust (A).

Donor grants also helped sustain a broad range of educational programs (Family Umbrella Group, Friday Harbor High School PTA, Salish Sea Sciences, San Juan Island School District, San Juan Public Schools Foundation, Spring Street International School, University of Washington Foundation—Friday Harbor Labs, the Whale Museum), visual and performing arts programs (Alchemy Art Center , Island Stage Left, San Juan Community Theatre, San Juan Islands Museum of Art), affordable housing programs (San Juan Community Home Trust (a), local food system sustainability (San Juan Islands Agricultural Guild), and community recreation (Families and Neighbors Support Island Rec).

SJICF donors directed **\$43,501** to the Joyce L. Sobel Family Resource Center in 2021, supporting a host of programs — from youth mentoring and parenting classes to emergency rental and utility aid, mental health counseling, and case management.



MAKING AN IMPACT BEYOND THE ISLAND

The Community Foundation's donors extended their philanthropy beyond the San Juan Islands in 2021, supporting offisland nonprofits and causes that align with their personal giving goals. Much of this funding **supported medical care** and research, including donations to the Swedish Medical Center Foundation, Hospice of the Northwest, the Medic One Foundation, Northwest Parkinson's Foundation, the University of Washington Eye Institute, and the University of Utah Moran Eye Center.

Grants from Community Foundation donors also supported a diverse collection of regional nonprofits (American Red Cross—Seattle. Cascade Public Media, Seattle Goodwill Industries, the Salvation Army) as well as organizations located throughout the United States (Annunciation House, Aspen Music Festival and School, Center for Animal Law Studies (D).

By directing all of their charitable giving through the Foundation, donors take advantage of our comprehensive approach to gift management. In addition to SJICF's professional investment management capabilities, we research all nonprofits to ensure that they meet legal and financial standards. We also provide oversight to ensure that charitable gifts are used in line with each donor's wishes.






REVENUE SOURCES

14% Legacy giving




GRANT RECIPIENTS BY LOCATION
